



When using the present tense (with 'to have' as the main verb), or the present perfect tense (with 'to have' as the auxiliary verb), 'has' is used only in the third person singular-- that is, when the subject is a single entity that is not you or I: he, she, it, John, the Eiffel Tower, etc. headache.

You have a headache.

She/ he/ it/ John/ the Eiffel Tower has a headache.

We have headaches.

You all have headaches.

They have headaches.

I have never eaten locusts.

You have never eaten locusts.

She/he/it/John/the Eiffel Tower has never eaten locusts.

We have never eaten locusts.

You all have never eaten locusts.

They have never eaten locusts.
